- What is AICE?
 - "AICE" is the Advanced International Certificate of Education
 - International Pre-University Preparation Program developed by the Cambridge Assessment Group
 - Internationally recognized in over 160 countries worldwide
- Who should take AICE?
 - ▶ Honors level, highly motivated students, international mindedness
- What does AICE look like at Beachside?
 - AICE DP Program (Diploma Program—7 AICE classes/ 3 years)
 - AICE Certificate Program (Select coursework—subject options)

^{**** 8021} English General Paper can only be taken as a qualifying syllabus in Group 4 - Interdisciplinary Subjects.

BHS Academic Integrity Statement

Please review the following components of the BHS Academic Integrity Statement with your students.

Academic Integrity is a student's commitment and demonstration of honest and moral behavior in the school setting.

A student who upholds a high standard of academic integrity maintains that the work he/she submits is authentic and true.

This means

- · Your work on each assignment or assessment will be your own work
- · You will not practice plagiarism in any form

- · You will not copy work or allow others to copy your work
- · You will not use AI to generate or complete assignments

Cheating includes the actual giving or receiving of any unauthorized aid or assistance on any form of any academic work.

Plagiarism is defined as the copying of or representation of another's work as one's own. This includes stealing or presenting the ideas or words of another as one's own or without crediting the original source. Students must make clear which words, ideas, images, and works are not their own, give credit for copied, adapted, and paraphrased material, and cite all sources appropriately in the text and reference page. Some examples of plagiarism include...

- Buying a paper or using a paper form a free internet site
- · Turning in another student's work with or without their knowledge
- Copying a paper, or any portion, from a source without the proper acknowledgement
- · Paraphrasing or copying material without the use of quotation marks and propre citation

Artificial Intelligence is defined as allowing computer systems to complete tasks that normally require human intelligence. Students should understand how to use AI tools in a responsible manner. AI platforms should only be used as a supplement when authorized by a teacher. Students shall not use AI platforms to avoid doing their own work. Should use of AI be permitted, it is the student's responsibility to acknowledge and cite the use of AI.

To promote academic integrity, teachers may screen student work through Turnitin.com. BHS teachers have been trained in Turnitin.com and understand the allowable threshold of plagiarism. All detection of below 20%. If a student receives a similarity report of at or above 20% further investigation may be prompted. Any submissions beyond the 20% threshold may require a teacher conference with the student to determine the originality of their work.

When a student violates the academic integrity policy, i.e. cheating, plagiarism, or unauthorized use of AI, the student will receive a 0% for the assignment/assessment, and parent contact will be made. Students may resubmit the assignment for a maximum score of 75%. Depending on the severity and/or frequency of the misconduct, conference with the deans may be required.

Let's Practice! Help Maria plan her AICE Diploma over the next three years.

Maria is starting her AICE journey in 10th grade and wants to earn her AICE Diploma by the end of 12th grade. To do this, she must pass 7 AICE exams within 3 years. The requirements are:

- •She must pass at least one course from each of the following groups:
 - Math/Science
 - Humanities
 - Core
 - Language
 - Interdisciplinary
- •She must also pass AICE English Language and AICE Global Perspectives (which counts as the Core subject).

Maria has the following AICE courses available to choose from:

- •Math/Science: AICE Psychology, AICE Physics, AICE Environmental Management
- •Humanities: AICE History, AICE Literature, AICE Environmental Management, AICE Proposition (Charles)
- Psychology, AICE Travel, AICE Drama, AICE Music (Chorus)
- •Language: AICE Spanish, AICE English Language
- •Interdisciplinary: AICE Thinking Skills, AICE General Paper
- •Core: AICE Global Perspectives (required)
- •Required courses: AICE English Language, AICE Global Perspectives
