AICE, AP and Dual Enrollment

Knowing the difference between AICE, AP and Dual Enrollment will assist you in planning for both high school and college courses







Descriptions:







AP and AICE

Students take college-level courses and exams. College credit can be earned if exam scores are level 3 or higher (AP) or level E or higher (AICE) and accepted by the college or university

Dual Enrollment

Students take college courses at SJRSC. Credit is earned by successfully completing the course.

Teachers/ Instructor:







AP and AICE

- Taught by certified high school teachers who are trained by the College Board or Cambridge AICE
- Parents and students can communicate with the teacher about student progress.
- Grades are viewable in HAC.

- Taught by college instructors credentialed to teach college level courses
- FERPA transfers the rights to view educational records to the student which means the instructor may not communicate with parents
- Parents cannot view grades until course is finished.

Location/ Scheduling:







AP and AICE

- Taught at Beachside HS
- AICE and AP courses are a commitment for both semesters of the school year.
 Students may not drop courses once they begin
- Students register
 via the normal high
 school registration
 process

- Taught at SJRSC or online
- Enrollment is by terms and follows the college's academic calendar
- Students must apply for DE before they can register for classes. Registration for college classes is separate form HS registration.
 Students must follow the posted timelines and directions

Eligibility and Requirements:







AP and AICE

- Open to any Beachside student who meets the SJCSD Honors criteria
- Level 4 or 5
 FAST/EOC score
 AND an A in the
 previous stnd
 course or C or
 higher in previous
 honors course
- Social and emotional maturity

- 3.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA
- Qualifying placement scores, which must be less than 2 years old (SAT, ACT, PSAT, PERT)
- Social and emotional maturity
- Submit a complete and accurate dual enrollment application

Are accelerated courses right for me?:







- Proficient in reading and writing
- Responsible: able to multitask, prioritize activities, make deadlines
- Committed to homework and a lot of extra reading and research
- Motivated and dedicated to school-work
- Resourceful: able to adapt and problem solve
- Able to self- advocate

Consider all factors:







- Consider all your commitments; work, extracurricular, etc.
- Ability to handle stress, do not sacrifice your mental health
- College considerations
- Transportation
- Graduation requirements
- Teacher recommendations
- Course availability

Understand the outcomes:








AP and AICE

- Potential college credits are applied differently by institution
- Weighted 1.0 in GPA

- The grade goes on both the HS and college transcript
- Credits transfer to all FL public colleges and universities. May not for out-ofstate colleges.
- Weighted 1.0 in GPA
