Bright Futures Student Evaluation Information

- Section 1
 - Make sure your name is correct
 - You must send your ACT and SAT scores to a public Florida University for it to show up on your evaluation. If you took the ACT or SAT after 9/27/2023 then it won't be on this evaluation.
 - You must turn in all service or work hours directly to Ms. Davis in the 2nd floor office for service hours to show up on your evaluation. You need 100 hours for the scholarship that pays the most money.
- Section 2
 - Three columns for three award levels. You can see what you are missing in each column.
- Section 3
 - This is your transcript data that Bright Futures uses to evaluate your GPA. Remember, Bright Futures calculates GPA differently than high schools. If you want to bring up your BF GPA, retake any classes you earned a D or F in on FLVS

Reviewing your post-secondary options

Credential or Certificate

- Community/State College; example – FSCJ, SJRSC, J-Tech
- Examples of careers: automotive, welding, HVAC, cosmetology, EMS, fire fighting,

State College – (Two-Year, Associate Degree) – SJRCS, FSCJ, TCC, Valencia, Santa Fe

- **AS Degree** – Two-year degree then straight into the workforce
 - Examples of careers: nursing, air traffic controller, dental hygienist, radiological tech, IT
- **AA Degree** – Two-year degree that transfers to a four-year college/university to earn Bachelor's Degree

Four Year College or University (Four-Year, Bachelor's Degree)

- Master's Degree - Can be obtained after Bachelor's Degree
- Doctorate Degree - Can be obtained after Master's Degree

Military

- Must take ASVAB

What is Financial Aid?

Financial aid is ANY Resource that can help you pay for college.

- Grants (you don't have to pay back)
- Loans (you DO have to pay back)
- Scholarships (you don't have to pay back)
- Work-Study (you don't have to pay back)

You can use financial aid to help pay for:

- Tuition
- Books
- Room & Board
- Supplies
- Transportation

Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Who should apply?
 - EVERYONE who wants to go to any type of school after high school
- When should you apply?
 - December of your senior year AND in October of every year after that while enrolled in college (check with your college for specific deadlines)
- What does this application cover?
 - Grants, Loans, and Work-Study provided by the Federal Government
- What do you need?
 - Your social security number, parents' social security number, your driver's license number (if you have one), alien registration number (if you are not a US citizen), federal tax information, tax documents, or tax returns, including W-2 information for you, and your parents, records of untaxed income for you and your parents, information on cash and investments
- How do you apply?

Snapshot of Bright Futures



You must apply by submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application



The scholarship will renew automatically every year if the student maintains the required GPA and credit hours



Seniors should try to meet all Bright Futures requirements by the end of FIRST semester



You must have all service/work hours turned in by graduation



ACT and SAT exams taken through August 31, 2024 will be accepted for evaluation purposes. You must send your ACT and SAT scores to a public Florida University for it to show up on your evaluation

What should seniors do NOW to qualify for Bright Futures?



Complete the Florida Financial Aid Application today



Review your Bright Futures student evaluation report that was given to you today



If you see any errors on section 3, notify your school counselor immediately



Take note of what is 'missing' to qualify for each award



Take steps to improve your Bright Futures GPA if it is borderline



Submit any remaining service hours/work hours by winter break



Take or re-take the ACT or SAT and report your scores to a Florida public university

Bright Futures Early Evaluation

Students cannot lose an award based on early evaluation unless they fail to earn a standard Florida high school diploma from a Florida public or FDOE-registered private high school.

Early Evaluation is based on:

- Required coursework and GPA through 7th semester (1st sem of senior year)
- Coursework in progress for 8th semester (2nd sem of senior year)
- Service hours earned through January 31
- Test scores for tests taken through January 31
- Transcripts should be submitted within 30 days of the end of each semester (SJCS D will submit all senior transcripts to Bright Futures automatically)

Bright Futures Final Evaluation

Final Evaluation is based on:

- All required coursework and GPA completed by high school graduation
- Service hours completed by high school graduation
- Test scores for all tests taken through August 31 of high school graduation year
- High school graduation date associated with earning a standard high school diploma
- Transcripts should be submitted within 30 days of the end of each semester (SJCSD will submit all senior transcripts to Bright Futures automatically)

Eligibility Notifications for Senior Year



Upon creation of a Student Account, students will receive a User Name and Password.



Students must check their online account for award notices – **students are responsible for keeping their demographic information updated and tracking their application and award status.**



Office of Student Financial Aid will post official award eligibility or ineligibility determinations to student online accounts.

Institutional Financial Aid

- Who should apply?
 - Talk to the college/university financial aid office to determine what programs you will qualify for
- When should you apply?
 - Contact college/university as every school has different deadlines
- What does this application cover?
 - Grants and Scholarships provided by the University or College
- What do you need?
 - Usually, the FAFSA must be filled out first but contact the college/university to find out more information
- How do you apply?
 - College and Universities generally have a separate application process for financial aid

SCHOLARSHIPS

The SJR State Foundation offers several scholarships, funded by the generous contributions of businesses, non-profit entities, and individuals.

Scholarship recipients must:

- Complete the scholarship application and provide additional documentation required (two letters of recommendation or two [recommendation forms](#) and essay response).
- Be a new or returning SJR State student.
- Must maintain a 2.0 GPA.
- Must complete all scholarship requirements.

We recommend completing the [FAFSA](#) because some but not all scholarships require it.

We invite you to apply for scholarships through our online portal system. One single application puts you in the applicant pool for [all scholarships](#). The application opens on November 1 and closes on April 1 every year.



This form will offer the person filling it out a more guided option in answering topics about the students. Two recommendations are still required for the scholarship application, there are now just options.

Make sure you have an appropriate e-mail address.

Scholarships – Get Organized!

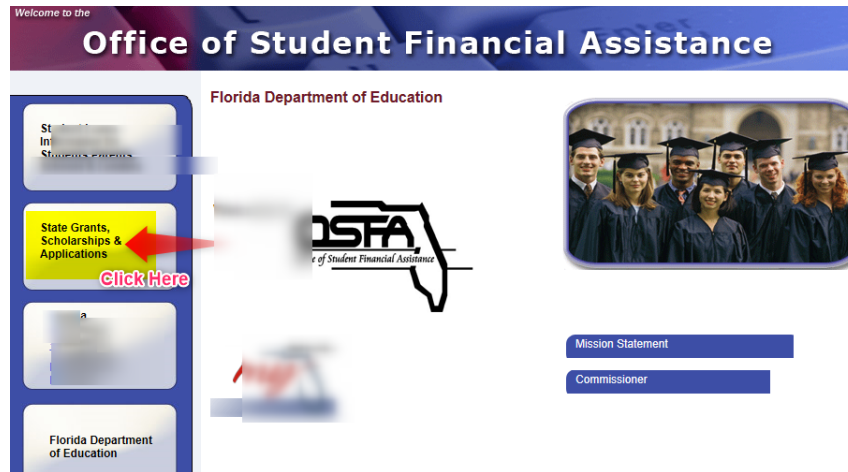
- Make a list of deadlines and don't miss them
- Keep a folder/file/binder with everything that is needed to apply for multiple scholarships.
 - ACT/SAT/PERT scores
 - High school transcript (request one from Naviance)
 - Letters of recommendation, if needed (because you may be able to use one for multiple scholarships)
 - Resume of activities, community service, and leadership roles
 - Essays (because you may be able to use one essay for multiple scholarships)

Scholarships – Beware of Scams

- NEVER pay for scholarships or searches.
- Scholarships are never guaranteed.
- Feel too good to be true? Do more research and ask around.
- Trust your instinct.
- Scholarships are gifts; they never have to be repaid.
- Don't give out bank account, credit card, or social security information.

First-Time Applicants
