



Recommendations vs Requests

Teachers are currently making <u>recommendations</u> for next year's core courses and upper-level electives.

• Feel free to look at our Course Progressions on our Course Selection webpage to see our recommended core course sequence.


<u>Requests</u> are the electives students get to pick to complete their 7 total courses for next year. BHS is an at capacity school, so all elective requests may not be honored.

SJCSD Honors Criteria

Grades – A grade of "C" or better in the previous honors course. Students earning an "A" in a previous standard class, may be recommended for Honors, AICE, or AP

AND

FSA/EOC – Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and no less than a level 3 in any area



RECOMMENDED COURSES (THIS IS NOT A SCHEDULE):

Please review these courses carefully. Teachers at BHS take course recommendations very seriously. Discuss the workload with your child.

- If you want to keep the courses listed above, make no marks and sign below
- If you want to drop a non-academy elective, mark through the course.
- If you want to change a course to a LOWER level, mark through the course and write the new course title.
- If you want to change a course to a HIGHER level, that you were not recommended for, fill out the course petition form that will be available at
 your registration appointment.. Requests will be reviewed in the summer after we have received updated testing scores and final grades.

HONORS CRITERIA

Students who meet AT LEAST ONE of the criteria listed below can take an Honors/AP/AICE level course.

- Grades A grade of "C" or better in the previous honors course. Students earning an "A" in a previous standard class, may be recommen
 for Honors or AP.
- FAST/FSA Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and not less than a level 3 in any area
- PSAT A score of 48 or higher on an appropriate assessment.
- PLAN A score of 170 (English), 210 (Math), or higher on the appropriate assessment.

FAST/FSA Reading scores will be used for placement in English and Social Studies courses and FSA Math scores will be used for Math and Science course This course request verification sheet <u>must be signed and returned to your child's school courselor during their course selection meeting</u>. Your signature confirms that you agree to the above recommendations and/or changes, and you understand the SCSD schedule change request policy.


Request Changes vs. Schedule Changes

Students can request the following when sitting with a counselor during their appointment in January/February:

- Electives
- Core Re-Evaluation (student will need to fill out a form to go into a higher-level course)
- Virtual lab (deadline to request the course on FLVS is May 24)
- Dual Enrollment intention for 11th and 12th grade

There are **no schedule changes**, so make sure recommendations and requests are correct by May 24. Students can view their requests and recommendations in HAC from March 1 – May 24.



AICE, AP, or Honors Course Level Changes

- AICE, AP, and Honors course levels can only be changed at the <u>semester</u> IF ...
 - Student has a D or F and
 - Student has consistently attended help sessions and
 - Parent and student have had a teacher conference and
 - There is a seat available in the desired course

Grade Forgiveness

Students can retake classes in which they earn a D or F (if the class is offered on FLVS, SJVS, or Edmentum Credit Recovery)

All grades appear on the official transcript. Forgiven grades will still show on transcript but will not be included in GPA calculation

All grade forgiveness should be completed before senior year

Options for grade recovery: St Johns Virtual School, Florida Virtual School, and/or Edmentum credit recovery*

*Courses taken via Edmentum credit recovery will not count towards NCAA eligibility

If grade forgiveness is necessary, students should request a Credit Recovery or Virtual Lab on their schedule for next school year during their meeting with the counselor

Your senior schedule should set you up for your first year out of high school



Going to a 4 year college or university? Take classes that will prepare you for your major. Take more classes beyond the minimum required for graduation.



Going to a vocational school? Take classes at FCTC to get a jump start on your education for free.



Going to SJRSC or FSCJ or another state college? Take SLS over the summer or during fall term to ease you into college mindset.

Reduced schedule/ Executive Intern (CO-OP)?

Reduced

- 12th graders can reduce up to 3 periods during their senior year if the student is on track for an on time high school graduation.
- Student should provide their own transportation.
- Morning or afternoon reduced periods cannot be guaranteed.
- Must have four credit bearing classes on schedule.


Blended

- Blend of classes at both Beachside HS and dual enrollment at either SJRSC or FCTC.
- Student should provide their own transportation.
- Seniors can choose to take all their classes with SJRSC (must take at least 12 credit hours per term)

Executive Intern (CO-OP)

- Students can have up to 4 executive intern periods cumulative during 11th and 12th grade and will be allowed to leave campus early.
- Students should provide their own transportation
- Students should work 25 hours a month for every period on their schedule.
- Assignments and pay stubs will be turned in to earn a grade in the course.
- This is a credit bearing class and will count towards one of the 4 periods students should take senior year.

Fall Dual Enrollment with SJRSC

Keep in Mind

Parents have no access to student's dual enrollment grades until they are added to both the college and high school transcript

College professors/academic advisors will not communicate with parents

All high school students who are taking dual enrollment classes are treated as an adult college student and will be taking classes with adult college students

High school counselors cannot advise on AA degree requirements or pre-requisites needed for intended majors. Students should contact SJRSC for degree requirements

Students should be extremely intentional when choosing dual enrollment courses to be sure they are getting pre-requisite credits needed for their college major. Students should research courses needed to complete their Bachelors degree at their intended university, then work backwards from there when choosing dual enrollment courses.

Beachside schedule cannot be modified or changed to accommodate dual enrollment classes

Blended Schedule with SJRSC Dual Enrollment

Student should tell counselor their intention to take dual enrollment at meeting and fill out the 'intent to take Dual Enrollment' form after selecting SJRSC classes

Counselor will not remove any courses from schedule until SJRSC gives us notification that the student is enrolled in courses

Student should pay attention to Schoology posts and Remind text messages, so they don't miss dual enrollment deadline of May 10

SJRSC and BHS Classes

Traditional dual enrollment students may take a maximum of ten (10) credit hours in the fall term, ten (10) credit hours in the spring term, and six (6) to eight (8) credit hours (a maximum of 2 courses total) for the summer term

SJRSC Classes (No BHS Classes) – Seniors Only

Early admissions students must take a minimum of twelve (12) and a maximum of sixteen (16) credit hours each fall and spring term.

What if the student does not have an English class or is absent on the day of the appointment?

There will be make up days

How do students know what electives are available?

What if the student doesn't want a non-academy elective they were recommended for?

Mark through the elective on the recommendation sheet and the counselor will take it off.

Can the student request a specific teacher or lunch for next year?

No

What if a student wants to take a lower-level class than the teacher recommended? Example: honors instead of AP

Mark through the course on the verification sheet and write the new course

What if a students want to take a higher-level class than the teacher recommended? Example: AP instead of honors

Fill out core recommendation re-evaluation form; admin will review over summer.

What if the student no longer wants to be in an academy elective?

Student should turn in the academy drop form with parent signature by 1/19. We will have drop forms available during appointments.

Can current 10th or 11th grade students apply for an academy?

- What if the student wants to take a course with SJVS or FLVS?

 Students will need to request a virtual lab on their schedule during the appointment with the counselor AND request the course on FLVS or SJVS by 5/24. Graduation requirements will not be removed from a schedule until the student is enrolled in the class online. Seniors must still be enrolled in 4 credit-bearing classes at BHS.
- What are the easy AP or AICE classes?

 There are no easy AP or AICE classes. They are college level classes with college level expectations.
- What if a student changes their mind about a course after 5/24? It's too late, at that point all requests will be finalized for the schedule

Who can get a reduced schedule (ie: less than 7 classes)?

Only seniors but we cannot guarantee they will get their choice of reduced (modified) periods. Seniors can only reduce up to 3 periods. Seniors must have four (4) credit-bearing courses on their schedule (this includes CO-OP).

Who can take an executive intern (CO-OP) course?

11th and 12th graders only. They can request up to 4 executive intern periods (CO-OP/work program) cumulative during 11th and 12th grade and will be allowed to leave early or come in late (depending on their other classes). Students should work 25 hours a month for every period of executive intern they have on their schedule

Who can be an office intern?

12th graders who request the class with their school counselor during the appointment. Credit bearing class, NOT able to earn service hours.

What if the student changes their mind about a course after their appointment with the counselor?

What if students wants to take all classes virtually?

Enroll full time at SJVS or FLVS and withdraw from BHS
