What are your career interests?	Explore careers through elective classes, summer internships, career interest inventories, etc. Research education/training requirements.		
What do you want to do after high school?	University, state college, military, career?		
Where do you want to go to college?	Visit colleges. Speak to admissions representatives. Ask questions about what the institution looks for in an applicant. Research required courses for your intended program of study.		
What are the admissions criteria for your school of choice?	Know the average test scores, average GPA, high school courses, world language requirement, etc.		
What do you want to study in college?	Choose high school courses that match your interest.		
Are you planning on taking anything online?	Students must declare intent to take courses virtually before the current school year ends. Students may not drop a class to take the same course online once they are enrolled in the course.		
Juniors & Seniors only: Do you plan on taking classes at SJRSC? Which class(es)?	Peruse the Saint Johns River State College course catalogue. Ask your college of choice if credits will transfer.		
Juniors & Seniors only: Do you have a job?	Discuss executive intern as a course option.		
Are you an athlete? If so, do your classes meet NCAA requirements?	Student athletes must register with the NCAA eligibility center and research the requirements for NCAA.		
Seniors only: Are you requesting to reduce your schedule? Morning or afternoon?	Know your needs ahead of time.
