### Assessment Requirements for 24 Credit Diploma

Must pass two assessments to graduate with diploma (otherwise you earn a Certificate Of Completion)

#### Algebra 1 EOC (level 3 or above) or

- ACT Math 16 or
- SAT Math 420 or
- PSAT/NMSQT Math 430 or
- FSA/FAST Geometry EOC Level 3 or
- CLT Quantitative Reasoning Section 11


- ACT Reading and English average 18 or
- •SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing 480 or

If you earn a COC that means you did not graduate from high school and your post-secondary options are limited

Credit and GPA Requirements for Standard 24 Credit Diploma

- 24 credits must be earned in all the following:
  - ✓ English 1, 2, 3, and 4
  - Algebra, Geometry, and two additional math courses
  - ✓ Biology and two additional sciences
  - ✓ World History, US History, Government, and Economics
  - Fine and Performing Arts, Speech and Debate, Career and Technical Education, or Practical Arts
  - ✓ HOPE (Health Opportunity through Physical Education)
  - ✓ 8 elective credits (students who entered high school in 2023-2024 SY and later - .50 credit personal financial literacy)
    - If you're planning to attend college, you will need two credits in the SAME world language
- 2.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA

### Recommendations vs Requests

Current teachers make <u>recommendations</u> for next year's core courses and upper-level electives.

Administration/counselors review these recommendations with student data and make changes as necessary.

• Feel free to look at our Course Progressions on our Course Selection webpage to see our recommended core course sequence.

<u>**Requests</u>** are the electives students get to pick to complete their 7 total courses for next year.</u>

Request Changes VS. Schedule Changes

- Students can request the following when sitting with a counselor during their appointment in Jan or Feb:
  - Electives
  - Core Re-Evaluation (student will need to fill out a form to go into a higher-level course)
  - Virtual lab for a course that is not offered at BHS
  - Dual Enrollment intention for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade
- There are no schedule changes, so make sure recommendations and requests are correct by March 14.
   Students can view their requests and recommendations in HAC from March 1 – March 14.

### Intensive Reading

- Schools are required by the District Decision Tree to place students in intensive reading if they score a level 1 or 2 on the FAST ELA Reading
  - Administration will review FAST scores during the summer and students will be placed in an intensive reading course.
  - 11th and 12th graders will have the opportunity to retest in the summer on July 17th.
    - Students who receive a passing score will no longer be enrolled in IR

Students can retake classes in which they earn a D or F (if the class is offered on FLVS, SJVS, or Edmentum Credit Recovery)

### All grades appear on the official transcript. Forgiven grades will still show on transcript but will not be included in GPA calculation

All grade forgiveness should be completed before senior year

Options for grade recovery: St Johns Virtual School, Florida Virtual School, and/or Edmentum credit recovery\*

\*Courses taken via Edmentum credit recovery will not count towards NCAA eligibility

If grade forgiveness is necessary, students should request a Credit Recovery or Virtual Lab on their schedule for next school year during their meeting with the counselor


### Career Interest Inventories

FAST/EOC – Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and no less than a level 3 in any area (PM 3)




### AICE, AP, or Honors Course Level Changes – SJCSD Policy

  - $\,\circ\,$  Student has a D or F and
  - Student has consistently attended help sessions and
  - Parent and student have had a teacher conference and
  - There is a seat available in the desired course

- What if the student does not have an English class or is absent on the day of the appointment?
  - $\,\circ\,$  There will be make up days
- How do students know what electives are available?
  - Course catalog can be found here: <u>https://www-bhs.stjohns.k12.fl.us/guidance/course-selections/</u>
- What if the student doesn't want a non-academy elective they were recommended for?
  - Mark through the elective on the recommendation sheet and the counselor will take it off.
- Can the student request a specific teacher or lunch for next year?
  - No

- What if a student wants to take a lower-level class than the teacher recommended? Example: honors instead of AP
  - Mark through the course on the verification sheet and write the new course
- What if a students want to take a higher-level class than the teacher recommended? Example: AP instead of honors
  - Fill out recommendation re-evaluation form; admin will review with test scores and final grades.
- What if the student no longer wants to be in an academy elective?
  - Student should have already filled out the academy drop form with parent signature by 1/24.
     We will have drop forms available during appointments.
- Can current 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade students apply for an academy?
  - No

- What if the student wants to take a course virtually?
  - Students can only take a class virtually if it is not offered at BHS. Students will need to request a virtual lab during the appointment with counselor.
- What are the easy AP or AICE classes?
  - There are no easy AP or AICE classes. They are college level classes with college level expectations.
- What if a student changes their mind about a course after 3/14?
  - It's too late, at that point all requests will be finalized for the schedule

- Who can get a reduced schedule (ie: less than 7 classes)?
  - Only seniors but we cannot guarantee they will get their choice of reduced (modified) periods.
     Seniors can only reduce up to 3 periods.
- Who can take an executive intern (CO-OP) course?
  - 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders only. They can request up to 4 executive intern periods (CO-OP/work program)
     <u>cumulative</u> during 11<sup>th</sup> <u>and</u> 12<sup>th</sup> grade and will be allowed to leave early or come in late (depending on their other classes). Students should work 25 hours a month for every period of executive intern they have on their schedule
- Who can be an office intern?
  - 12<sup>th</sup> graders who request the class with their school counselor during the appointment. Credit bearing class, NOT able to earn service hours.
- What if the student changes their mind about a course after their appointment with the counselor?
