## What to know about the PSAT/NMSQT

Anticipated test date: October 2025 (specific date, TBA)

Cost for 10<sup>th</sup> graders: \$0 (district pays cost)

Test length: 2 hours, 14 minutes

Test will be digital. Scores will be accessed through the students CollegeBoard account.

Scale ranges: 320 – 1520 for the total score

PSAT/NMSQT Math 430 or above = Comparative score for Algebra 1 EOC

No penalty for guessing or blank responses

## ACT/SAT/PSAT/AP Test Accommodations

If your child has a disability that affects how they test, accommodations are available (IEP or 504 plan).

Your goal should be to finish 100 hours of community service/paid work hours by the end of 11<sup>th</sup> grade so you will qualify for the highest level of the BF scholarship



During Junior year, take ACT and/or SAT and send scores to Florida universities
