



Graduation Requirements

24 credits must be earned in all the following:

- English 1, 2, 3, and 4
- Algebra, Geometry, and two additional math courses
- Biology and two additional sciences
- World History, US History, Government, and Economics
- 1 Fine and performing art, speech and debate, career and technical education, or practical arts
- HOPE
- Financial Literacy (.50 credit)

2.0 unweighted, cumulative GPA

Must pass two assessments – Algebra 1 EOC and 10th grade FAST ELA (PM3)




FAST/EOC – Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and no less than a level 3 in any area (PM 3)

Honors Criteria

Recommendation Sheet - Front

- Students will receive from middle schools any time after February 28 and before their course selection appointment
- If you want to drop a non-academy elective, mark through the course.
- If you want to change a course to a lower level, mark through the course and write the new course title.
- If you want to change the course to a higher level, fill out the form that will be available at the appointment.
- Sign and return with student on day of appointment

- MS Appointments are not advising appointments. They are quick 2-5 minute meetings to select elective courses







How to view Course Recommendations in HAC – Viewable from March 1-14

- Log into STUDENT HAC account
- Click Classes icon
- Click Requests tab
- Scroll down to view all requests

Request Changes Schedule Changes

- Students can request the following when sitting with a counselor during their appointment in Jan or Feb:
 - Electives
 - Core Re-Evaluation (student will need to fill out a form to go into a higher-level course)
 - Virtual lab for a course that is not offered at BHS
 - Dual Enrollment intention for 11th and 12th grade
- There are no schedule changes, so make sure recommendations and requests are correct by March 14.
 Students can view their requests and recommendations in HAC from March 1 March 14.



AICE, AP, or Honors Course Level Changes – SJCSD Policy

- AICE, AP, and Honors course levels can only be changed at the <u>semester</u> IF ...
 - Student has a D or F and
 - Student has consistently attended help sessions and
 - Parent and student have had a teacher conference and
 - There is a seat available in the desired course

Intensive Reading

- Schools are required by the District Decision Tree to place students in intensive reading if they score a level 1 or 2 on the FAST ELA Reading
 - Administration will review FAST scores during the summer and students will be placed in an intensive reading course.

Grade Point Average

- EVERYTHING COUNTS IN HIGH SCHOOL
- GPA's update after every semester (8 times total in high school):
 - In January, after semester 1 grades post
 - In the summer, after semester 2 grades post
- Only cumulative unweighted GPA counts towards graduation and qualifications for Dual Enrollment
- AICE, AP, Dual Enrollment, and honors counts towards your weighted GPA
- Bright Futures GPA will be different from Beachside GPA (they recalculate based on only certain classes)

Self Advocacy

If a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to ask the teacher for make up work and turn it in

High School students are expected to handle their own communication with teachers and school counselors

Community Service/Paid Work Hours

- Not needed for graduation
- \$ Needed for \$\$ (scholarships, including Bright Futures)
- Your goal should be to finish 100 hours of community service/paid work hours by the end of 11th grade so you will qualify for the highest level of the BF scholarship
