



# Graduation Requirements

Assessments (Algebra 1 EOC and Grade 10 Language Arts -ELA)

2.0 Cumulative, Unweighted GPA

24 specific credits

### Assessments

- Must pass two assessments to graduate with diploma (otherwise you earn a Certificate Of Completion)
  - Algebra 1 EOC (level 3 or above) or
    - ACT Math 16 or
    - SAT Math 420 or
    - PSAT/NMSQT Math 430 or
    - FSA Geometry EOC Level 3 or
    - CLT Quantitative Reasoning section 14
  - Grade 10 ELA FAST or
    - ACT Reading and English average 18 or
    - SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing 490 or
    - PSAT/NMSQT Reading and Writing 470 or
    - CLT Verbal Reasoning and Grammar/Writing sections sum 39
- If you earn a COC that means you did not graduate from high school and your post-secondary options are limited

## GPA


- GPA 2.0 cumulative <u>unweighted</u> or higher
  - 2.0 is a "C" average
  - Check HAC regularly to keep track of grades

### Credits

- 24 credits must be earned in all the following:
  - English 1, 2, 3, and 4
  - Algebra, Geometry, and two additional math courses
  - Biology and two additional sciences
  - World History, US History, Government, and Economics
  - Fine and Performing Arts, Speech and Debate, Career and Technical Education, or Practical Arts
  - HOPE
  - 8 elective credits (to include .5 credit of personal financial literacy only for ninth grade entry year of 2023-2024 and beyond)
    - If you're planning to attend college, you will need two credits in the SAME world language



### Student Log In:

Students will get their active directory information today which includes their HAC login

# How to check out a student and report an absence ...

- 1. When students need to be checked out before the end of the school day, and early check out from should be submitted no later than 10 am the day of check-out.

# Steps to play a sport for BHS

- 1. Scan QR code for all forms
- 2. Gather the following items:
  - 1. An updated physical on the appropriate FHSAA EL2 form (found on the athletics website)
  - 2. Proof of taking 3 on-line courses in the athlete's name (not parents name)
    - 1. FHSAA Heat Illness Certificate
    - 2. FHSAA Sudden Cardiac Arrest Certificate
    - 3. FHSAA Concussion Video Certificate
- 3. Register with the FHSAA by going to <a href="https://www.athleticclearance.com">www.athleticclearance.com</a>
- 4. Once you reach the confirmation message the data will be electronically filed with the Beachside Athletic Department for review.
- 5. When your student is cleared, you will receive an email from the BHS athletic department.


