The goal of the BHS Master Schedule is to create individual student schedules that meet the educational needs of all students, at the appropriate level, in the appropriate format, and in the appropriate sequence. The master schedule creates teaching assignments that utilize instructional staff in the areas in which they are certified, and to balance the course load of each teacher, while being mindful of the number of standard/honors/advanced courses that each teacher is assigned.

October/November/December:

Teachers begin making course recommendations
\square Speak with your teacher about the next course in the progression and ask any questions you have about course content

Keep in Mind the following information regarding course recommendations:

- The **district recommendation** for student placement in an honors or advanced course is as follows:
 - For placement in honors mathematics, English, social studies, science or foreign language students should meet any one of the following:
 - A grade of C or better in the previous honors course OR a grade of A in the previous standard course
 - FAST (or EOC) Level 4 or 5 in appropriate area and not less than a Level 3 in any area
 - PSAT score of 480
 - PLAN score of 170 (English), 210 (mathematics)
 - Norm Referenced Test Stanine score of 7, 8, or 9

Per the SJCSD Student Progression Plan, science and math co-requisites must be honored unless a conversation is held with the school counselor and/or administration. This can be requested via the online request form.

Each teacher should make a recommendation for the next appropriate course on a student-by-student basis. These recommendations should be made based on student academic data. While it can be a factor, making a recommendation based on student behavior/personality, is not an appropriate single piece of data when making these decisions.

8th Grade Student Registration Meetings with BHS counselors (8th grade students will meet with their BHS counselor to choose courses for 9th grade. <u>This is not an advising appointment</u>. If a parent would like to participate in this course selection meeting, their student will be permitted to call them to participate by phone. (If you or your parents have questions not related to course selection, you may schedule a meeting with your high school counselor at a later time.)

Students will have the opportunity to request a change to their requested courses- be on the lookout for a school messenger with a Microsoft link to complete for a schedule review. The deadline to complete this link is Friday, March 14, 2025.

July: District-Wide Schedule Preview in HAC

Course reviews may be requested during schedule preview by using the Microsoft link posted on the BHS webpage. Schedule reviews will only be considered for the following reasons:

COURSE CORRECTION REQUESTS DURING SCHEDULE PREVIEW:

- Once the student schedule is released, students may only request a schedule correction for the following reasons:
 - Duplicate course
 - Missing a course
 - Misplaced/wrong level

[All **incoming 9th graders** participating in a virtual course between their 8th and 9th grade year **MUST** change their building designation in FLVS/SJVS to Beachside High School after the last day of their 8th grade year. The course needs to be complete by August 1st.]

COURSE CORRECTION REQUESTS AFTER THE SCHOOL YEAR HAS BEGUN:

<u>Please note</u>: Changing a course is at the discretion of the school based on student need and availability. Placement based on FAST/EOC scores may supersede request

- Requesting a change to a year-long course may occur at the end of the semester, only if all the following conditions have been met:
 - grade of D or F
 - completion of a parent conference

- demonstration of the student seeking consistent academic assistance
- Requesting a change to a half-credit course, may occur at the end of the quarter, only if all the following conditions have been met:
 - a grade of D or F
 - completion of a parent/legal guardian conference
 - demonstration of the student seeking consistent academic assistance

IMPORTANT ITEMS TO NOTE:

- Junior and Senior students who are scheduled for Intensive Reading (IR) will have the opportunity to retake the FAST Grade 10 Reading assessment during the summer months. If a JUNIOR or SENIOR retests and scores a level 3 or higher, that student will be removed from IR for the school year. If the student does not test during the summer retake session and/or does not score a level 3 or higher, the student will remain in IR. A schedule change for JUNIOR or SENIOR IR students will be made at the end of the first semester if a student scores a level 3 or higher during the fall or winter FAST retake windows or attains a concordant score
- Beginning in the 2026-27 School Year, ninth grade students will have required social studies courses on their schedule
- Students graduating in 2027 and beyond are required to complete Personal Financial Literacy as a graduation requirement
