

The following information is pertaining to students taking AP exams in May.

AP Students and Parents/Guardians,

Good afternoon! You are receiving this e-mail because you/your child is registered for one or more AP test(s) in the coming weeks. Exams are scheduled from Monday, May 6th - Friday, May 17th. Please note that AP exam dates and times are set nationally by College Board and must be followed. Please be sure to read this email in its entirety, as it addresses important information about the upcoming test.

AP Schedule and Locations:	*Students should arrive at least 30-45 minutes prior to the start
	time.

Morning Exams:

- Report Time: No later than 7:30am
- Report directly to your assigned testing room.
- Lunch: Students will still get a lunch if the time runs over.
- Extended time students and students taking two tests in a day should bring their lunch from home.

Afternoon Exams:

- Report Time: 11:30am
- Report directly to your assigned testing room.
- Students may want to have a plan for transportation, in case an exam ends later than 4:05 p.m.
- End times for afternoon tests are unpredictable and may vary from day to day. Afternoon extended time exams will likely end later than the last bell.
- Lunch: Students will still get a lunch if the time conflicts.

Two exams in a day:

You will need to provide your own lunch. You will have an opportunity to eat (quickly, \sim 15 minutes) in a designated area between exams. You might also consider bringing a "snack lunch" that you can space out and eat during the exam breaks and the break between tests.



All Exams:

- Please be ready to go when you arrive! Pencils sharpened, stopped at the restroom, etc. Check the list of what to bring/not bring below. We will begin promptly!
- Students cannot be dismissed early. All test takers must remain until all tests are collected and counted.
- <u>Students should bring with them only what is necessary for exams</u>. In most testing rooms, we have very little extra space for student belongings.
- What to Bring:
 - Several sharpened No. 2 Pencils with erasers (not mechanical pencils)
 - Pens (dark blue or black ink only)
 - Calculator (Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Micro, Macro, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Physics only) - <u>be sure yours meets the requirements</u>. No calculators will be provided.
 - A ruler for Physics tests that allow a ruler. No protractors allowed.
 - Photo ID (if you are not an BHS student)
 - Layers of clothing (It could be 80+ in the gym/Auditorium, or it could be 65. It's unpredictable)
 - Water/small snack
 - Bagged lunch if you have two exams in the same day, or if you have a morning extended time test. You might consider bringing a "snack/lunch" that you can eat throughout the day if you are taking multiple tests.



What NOT to Bring:

- Backpack/Large Bag if at all avoidable. You will not be able to bring the bag into the testing area.
- Test Prep Books/Class Notes/Textbooks/etc These cannot enter the test room at all.
 Leave them home.
- Cell Phones/Smartwatches The official College Board policy is no phones in the testing room. Any cell phones, etc. that make it to the testing room will be turned off, collected, and returned to you after all exams have been collected. If you do not want us to take it, don't bring it at all.
- Mechanical Pencils
- Anything that makes noise
- Anything that covers your head (hoodie, hat)

The College Board requires that all students accept the terms and conditions. You will be asked for confirmation of your agreement to these terms as part of your test on exam day.

AP Exam Terms and Conditions

Sending Scores

Beginning on April 11th, the AP Classroom will prompt you to select where to send your scores. You can bypass that prompt by clicking the link "I don't want to send my scores".

Seniors should send their official scores to the college they will attend. This will send all exam scores for all AP exams you ever took. The deadline to make this request is in June for 2024 Exams.

- 1. Log in to My AP
- 2. Click on My AP Profile in the blue section, towards the right
- 3. Click on Score Send
- 4. Indicate to what college you would like your scores to be sent.
- 5. Be sure to Save!



Score Release

Scores will be available in July 2024. Scores are released online.
